<p><b>Goals for a Life Group:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• “<i>Watch over one another in love.</i>” by John Wesley, Founder of Methodism</li><li>• To become more like Christ.</li><li>• To help others become more like Christ</li></ul> <p><u>Not</u> about gossip, complaining, judgment, playing the victim, mental health therapy, or talking about what others need to do for you.</p> <p><u>All</u> members of the group...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• ...must commit to meet on a regular basis</li><li>• ...must commit to complete confidentiality.</li><li>• ...must participate.</li><li>• ...agree to provide positive support and hold each other accountable.</li><li>• ...agree to pray for each other each week.</li><li>• ...must commit to be there for each other for the long-term.</li></ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Welcome</li><li>2. Each member of the group takes the time to answer questions (you can use these or you can make-up your own questions):<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. What has been going on in your life?</li><li>b. What have you been doing to keep God in your life every day?<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>i. What will you be doing in the future?</li></ol></li><li>c. Where did you deny Christ and not allow Him to be your Lord and Savior?<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>i. What will you be doing about it in the future?</li></ol></li><li>d. How is your relationship with others?<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>i. What will you be doing in the future?</li></ol></li><li>e. Where can we celebrate the moving of the Holy Spirit in your life?</li></ol></li><li>3. Each member of the group takes a turn to pray out-loud; or a different group member prays out-loud at the end of each meeting.</li></ol>
